Executive Session

This is a reminder that the Village Council will convene for an executive session after the May 14 Village Council Meeting to begin the decision making process for filling the vacant Village Council seat.

Annual Fire Hydrant Maintenance and Flow Testing Ongoing

The Village annually inspects all fire hydrants and conducts flow tests of 20% of the hydrants. This schedule of maintenance ensures proper operation of the hydrants and is one component of the Village's ISO Class 1 rating. Currently, flow testing is occurring in the middle section of the Village from approximately the BNSF railroad tracks to 63rd Street. Signs are posted in areas where flow testing is occurring. Once flow testing is complete, maintenance of the remaining fire hydrants will start at the south end of the Village and work north. Complete project completion is estimated to be the end of June.

Spring 2019 Tree Planting

Parkway tree planting is scheduled to begin Monday May 13, and should be completed by Friday May 24, weather depending. A total of 211 trees will be planted representing 31 different tree species, including 6 unique oak species. Of the 211 trees, 25 are new tree plantings where there was no tree before, and the remaining 186 trees are placements for trees removed due to emerald ash borer infestations, disease, decline or storm damage.

A TreeGator® will be made available for each newly planted parkway tree, which allows residents to effectively and easily water the new trees. A TreeGator® is a 20-gallon plastic reservoir that attaches around the trunk of the tree.
