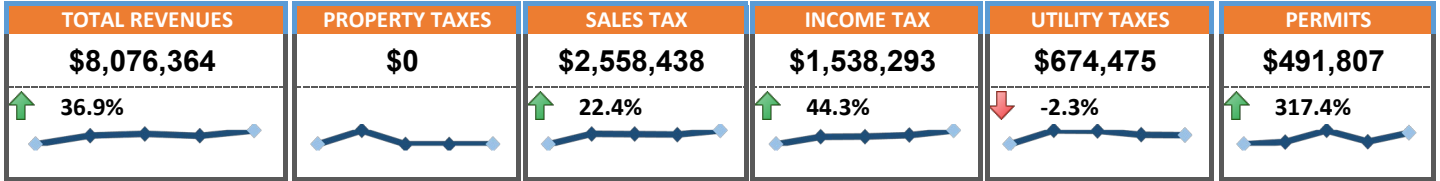


# GENERAL FUND REVENUES-for the Two Months Ending 2/28/2022

## HIGHLIGHTS

February 2022 YTD revenues are 36.9% or \$2,175K higher than February 2021 YTD. Food & Beverage Tax (\$246K) is higher due to the rate increase effective March 2021 and also due to lifted COVID restrictions on indoor dining. The hospitality industry is slowly recovering from COVID, as hotel revenues are higher than last year (18K). Sales Tax (\$468K), Home Rule Sales Tax (\$84K), State Income Tax (\$472K) and State Shared Revenue (\$24K) are higher than last year. Fees, Charges and Fines mainly increased due to Ambulance revenue (\$490K). Building Permits (\$374K) are higher due to the OPUS development on Main and Maple Ave. Telecommunications Tax (\$29K) is trailing behind last year.

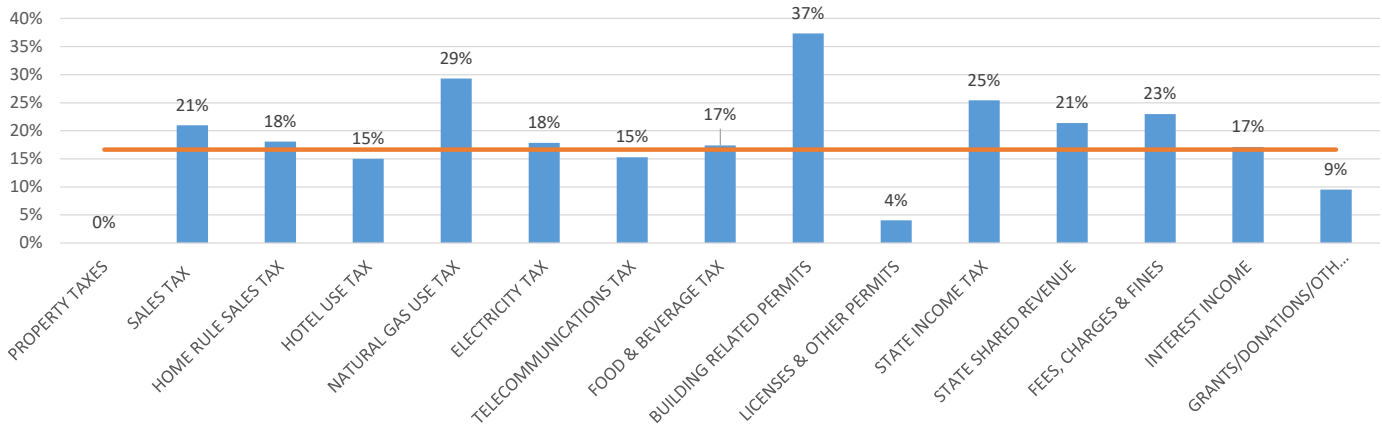
## General Fund Revenue Analysis - Major Sources

### % of Budgeted Revenues Collected YTD-target 17% or more



The orange line in this graph represents a "target" of 17%. The target is calculated by dividing 2 months by 12 months in the year. Property taxes are received in two distributions - in June and September. Natural Gas Tax is seasonal with a greater portion received in the winter months. Building related permits are also seasonal, with a greater portion of revenue received in the summer.

Note: Revenues are recorded on a cash basis. Sales tax is received from the state three months after the sale is made. For example, January sales taxes are from sales made in October.
