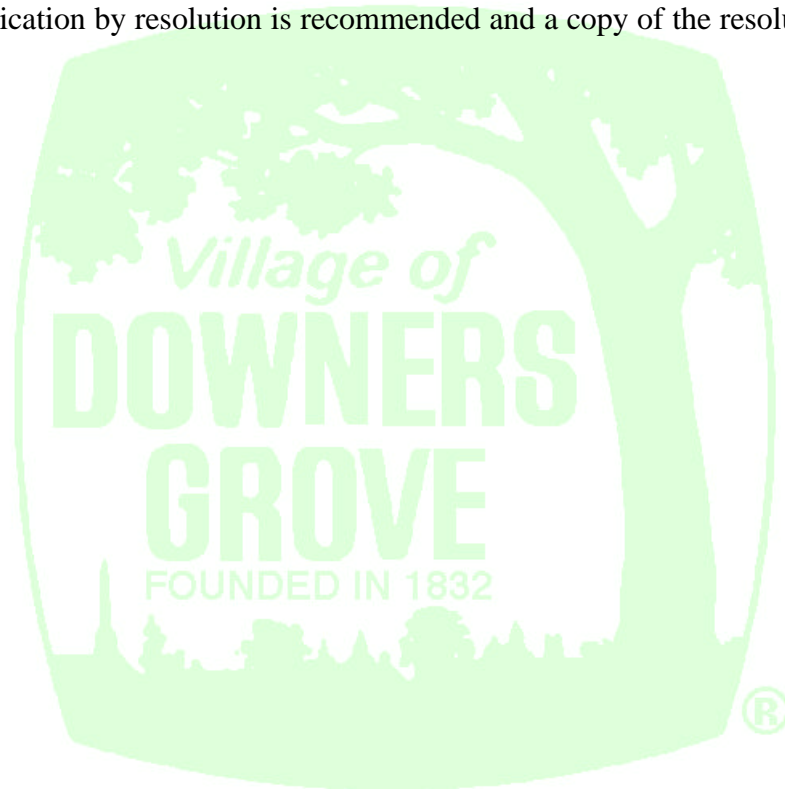

Narrative Statement

Project Description

Please provide your narrative statement in the space provided below:

I. Project Description

The major goal of the Downers Grove Fire Department is to provide exemplary fire, medical, and other emergency services to the Village of Downers Grove residents, businesses, and visitors.

The Downers Grove Fire Department is requesting funding to support the replacement of our 1989 Ford/E-One engine. This engine has close to 100,000 in miles on it and has severe frame problems caused by general wear and winter salt. The cab of the engine is obsolete; Ford no longer produces it. The life expectancy of a commercial type truck such as ours is much shorter than that of a custom made vehicle. The total estimated cost of a new vehicle is \$375,000; we are requesting \$337,500 in grant funding. This funding will support the acquisition of a new triple-combination pumper. This pumper will have a 1250 GPM pump with a 500-gallon tank. It will hold a minimum of 1000 feet of 5-inch hose, 1000 feet of 3-inch hose, (2) 1 ¼ inch pre-connects and (1) 2 1/2 pre-connect. It will carry a 28-foot combination ladder, a 14-foot roof ladder, and a folding attic ladder.

This vehicle will be equipped with compartments that will be large enough to hold a variety of tools and equipment that the Department normally carries as standard procedure. The equipment and tools will include a generator, Amkus mini-pump, fan, axes, pike poles, rope, tarps, 4-gas monitors, and a variety of other essential fire and rescue equipment.

Funding of this project will provide relief to our aging infrastructure. Two of our three front line engines are 1995 Pierce Saber engines; both of which have over 80,000 miles on them. Our reserve engine is in severe need of replacement. Once replaced, we will move the new engine to the front line and move one of the 1995 Pierce engines into reserve.

Our Community is protected by three front line engines and one reserve, a tower ladder, a squad truck, and three ambulances. If the reserve has to be retired prior to replacement, the Department will not be able to maintain its current level of response when any of the other engines break down or need maintenance.

II. Benefits to our Community & Department

The Village of Downers Grove covers an area of 22 square miles and serves a population of 48,724. Its daytime population swells to over 125,000. The Village of Downers Grove is home to more than 2,000 businesses, including such hotels as the Marriott, Doubletree Guest Suites and the Holiday Inn. Additionally, the Downers Grove Fire Department responds automatically (auto-aid) to all reported fires in the Lisle-Woodridge Fire District, Darien-Woodridge Fire District and the Village of Westmont. The Downers Grove Fire Department is a member of MABAS 16 and also responds to MABAS 10 and MABAS 12 communities. It is also an integral part of the CART (Combined Agency Response Team). CART is a large organization that provides specialized rescue personnel and equipment to many communities. The CART border extends 63 miles south of Downers Grove and covers a population of 1 million people.

Even though the budget has been adversely affected by the economy, the Village is committed to the safety of its residents, businesses, and visitors. Federal funding will help the Village meet these needs. Funding of this grant will allow us to maximize the productivity of our current resources. More importantly, funding of this grant will allow our community to be a safer place to live and to conduct business.

III. Why this project can't be funded solely through local funding.

For the past several fiscal years, the Village has experienced significant declines in its economic based revenue. The state of the economy, as well as world events, has created many significant challenges for the Village none greater than Homeland Security and how we can protect our residents, visitors, and businesses. The Village has seen declines in Sales, Telecommunications, and Utility Tax Revenue. The downturn of telecommunication tax can be attributed to the preferred use of cell phones over the traditional land-line phones. Deregulation of the natural gas industry has resulted in a gas utility tax no longer paid by many users. The state has also eliminated the Photo Processing tax distribution to municipalities, which has had a negative impact. E-commerce has eroded municipal sales tax collections. The end result is that funding the Village would have received from these sources to support the Village's equipment replacement schedule must now be allocated to on-going operational expenses for public safety and public works. Therefore, the Village is seeking other outside sources to fund these necessary and critically needed vehicles. Funding of this project will help our community meet the challenges of the 21st Century.

- (2) Requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State, or local health, law enforcement or other appropriate

agency.
