### **Spring 2023 Tree Planting**

Parkway tree planting is scheduled to begin Tuesday, June 6th. All plantings should be completed by June 15 weather depending. A total of 152 trees will be planted representing 25 different tree species, including 5 unique oak species. Of the 152 trees, 49 are new tree plantings where there was no tree before, and the remaining 103 trees are replacements for trees removed due to EAB infestations, disease, decline or storm damage. Also, the Village will be honoring 46 specific tree species requests, thereby improving resident satisfaction and the likelihood of long-term tree survival.

### **Street Resurfacing**

DuPage County of Transportation will be resurfacing Maple Avenue from IL 53 to Belmont Road. The project is scheduled from early June to early September. The work will consist of curb & gutter repairs, sidewalk work, milling, pavement patching, resurfacing, and new pavement markings. The work will be performed mainly under traffic with daily lane closures. The contact at the county is Keith Warf at 630-407-6900.

### **DuPage River Sweep**

Downers Grove had 53 volunteers (including 5 staff members) at 4 locations in Downers Grove to pick up trash as part of the annual DuPage River Sweep organized by The Conservation Foundation. We collected about 73 bags of trash, along with some larger trash like barricades, rusted signs, signposts, and corrugated pipe. Throughout DuPage County about 700 volunteers were cleaning up throughout the DuPage River watershed on Saturday.
