Consent Agenda - H. Motion: A motion authorizing a \$30,000 contribution to the DuPage Senior Citizens Council (DSCC) for the Meals on Wheels Program for FY 23

1. Commissioner Gilmartin has requested that this item be removed from Consent and tabled to the March 7, 2023 meeting. Per Village Council rules, the item is automatically removed from the Consent Agenda. A motion to table to the March 7 Council meeting is required.

First Reading - C. Motion: A motion approving an agreement with Alliance Contractors, Inc. of Woodstock, IL, for the 2023 Downtown Business District (DBD) Crosswalk, Accessibility and Traffic Signal Improvements Project.

1. The contract specifications say that the pavement must remain idle for 30 days. What does this mean?
 - a. *The decorative crosswalk material cannot be applied to fresh concrete or asphalt pavement. The pavement must be allowed to fully cure for 30 days first to allow for optimal adhesion and longevity of the application.*
2. There is a difference in the length of warranty based on the paving material of the base (asphalt or concrete). What pavement is under the existing crosswalks that have been reconstructed?
 - a. *The pavement material varies depending on the street to which the crosswalk is being applied. Main Street between Franklin and Maple, and Curtiss Street between Forest and Washington, are concrete. Other streets in the downtown business district are generally asphalt. The warranty for material that is placed on new asphalt or concrete is 10 years. All of the crosswalks included in this project will be placed over new asphalt or concrete.*
